[Grading Policy in the Time of COVID-19: Considerations and Implications for Equity](#)

The COVID-19 pandemic serves as a reminder that achieving equity for all students has always been a challenge; differential access to learning threatens to exacerbate existing disparities among students, schools, and districts. This brief explores some of the policy options that California districts and other states have pursued, as well as considerations and trade-offs related to equity.

To address the needs of underserved schools, AIR created the READI framework. Instead of viewing readiness as a mechanism for sorting schools out of programs, the framework helps states and districts flip their focus and define readiness by assessing how well the improvement program targets the specific needs of underserved schools.

[California's Early Learning and Care Providers: Essential Workers Who Need Support](#)

The research brief shares results from focus groups conducted in May 2020 with early learning providers about their needs and experiences during the COVID-19 pandemic. This research shows that the health crisis has taken a significant toll on early learning providers and that they continue to face challenges supporting young children, especially dual language learners. It also underscores the reality that early learning programs need more resources to continue.

[COVID-19 and the Squeeze on State Education Budgets: Equity Implications for New York State](#)

AIR examined New York's post-COVID-19 Enacted Budget and compared it to the Executive Budget, released in January, to understand the effect of COVID-19 on state aid received by districts, with a focus on how differences between the two budgets related to district poverty levels.
